

Divine Healing

3 John 1:2

Beloved, I wish above all things that thou mayest prosper and be in **health**, even as thy soul (psychē) prospereth.

hygiainō — 12× to be sound, in health, Lk. 5:31; 7:10; to be safe and sound, Lk. 15:27; 3 Jn. 2; met. to be healthful or sound in faith, doctrine, etc., Tit. 1:9, 13; 2:1, 2; sound, pure, uncorrupted, 1 Tim. 1:10; 6:3; 2 Tim. 1:13; 4:3

1 Thessalonians 5:23-24

And the very God of peace sanctify you wholly; and I pray God your whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. 24 Faithful is he that calleth you, who also will do it.

Exodus 15:23-26

And when they came to Marah, they could not drink of the waters of Marah, for they were bitter: therefore the name of it was called Marah. 24 And the people murmured against Moses, saying, What shall we drink? 25 And he cried unto the LORD; and the LORD shewed him a tree, which when he had cast into the waters, the waters were made sweet: there he made for them a statute and an ordinance, and there he proved them, 26 And said, If thou wilt diligently hearken to the voice of the LORD thy God, and wilt do that which is right in his sight, and wilt give ear to his commandments, and keep all his statutes, I will put none of these diseases upon thee, which I have brought upon the Egyptians: for I am the LORD that healeth thee.

10 diseases/plagues that were curses because of disobedience.

Fourteen causes of plagues:

1. Not listening to God (Ex. 15:26; Lev. 26:14; Dt. 28:15)
2. Failing to do the right (Ex. 15:26)
3. Breaking the commandments (Ex. 15:26; Lev. 26:14-15 Dt. 28:15)
4. Despising God's statutes (Lev. 26:15)
5. Abhorring God's judgments (Lev. 26:15)
6. Breaking God's covenants (Lev. 26:15)
7. Walking contrary to God (Lev. 26:21-27)
8. Sinning against God (Dt. 28:20)
9. Forsaking God (Dt. 28:20)
10. Rebellion against God (Dt. 28:47)
11. Refusing to be thankful for all God's blessings (Dt. 28:47)
 - Deuteronomy 28:47 Because thou servedst not the LORD thy God with joyfulness, and with gladness of heart, for the abundance of all things
12. Refusing to observe all God's laws (Dt. 28:58-62)
13. Adding to God's Word (Rev. 22:18)
14. Taking away from God's Word (Rev. 22:19; Dt. 4:2; 12:32; Prov. 30:6)

Matthew 8:16-17

When the even was come, they brought unto him many that were possessed with devils: and he cast out the spirits with his word, and healed all that were sick: 17 That it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Esaias the prophet, saying, Himself took our infirmities (astheneia), and bare our sicknesses (nosos).

astheneia 24× — want of strength, weakness, feebleness, 1 Cor 15:43; bodily infirmity, state of ill health, sickness, Mt 8:17;

1 Corinthians 15:43

It is sown in dishonour; it is raised in glory: it is sown in weakness; it is raised in power:

nosos — disease, infirmity, sickness.

AV (12) - disease 6, sickness 5, infirmity 1;

Matthew 10:1

And when he had called unto him his twelve disciples, he gave them power against unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal all manner of sickness (nosos) and all manner of disease (malakia).

Only used by Matthew:

malakia 3× — softness; listlessness, indisposition, weakness, infirmity of body

Matthew 12:22-32

Then was brought unto him one possessed with a devil, blind, and dumb: and he healed him, insomuch that the blind and dumb both spake and saw. 23 And all the people were amazed, and said, Is not this the son of David? 24 But when the Pharisees heard it, they said, This fellow doth not cast out devils, but by Beelzebub the prince of the devils. 25 And Jesus knew their thoughts, and said unto them, Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation; and every city or house divided against itself shall not stand: 26 And if Satan cast out Satan, he is divided against himself; how shall then his kingdom stand? 27 And if I by Beelzebub cast out devils, by whom do your children cast them out? therefore they shall be your judges. 28 But if I cast out devils by the Spirit of God, then the kingdom of God is come unto you. 29 Or else how can one enter into a strong man's house, and spoil his goods, except he first bind the strong man? and then he will spoil his house. 30 He that is not with me is against me; and he that gathereth not with me scattereth abroad. 31 Wherefore I say unto you, All manner of sin and blasphemy shall be forgiven unto men: but the blasphemy against the Holy Ghost shall not be forgiven unto men. 32 And whosoever speaketh a word against the Son of man, it shall be forgiven him: but whosoever speaketh against the Holy Ghost, it shall not be forgiven him, neither in this world, neither in the world to come.

astheneia:

2 Corinthians 11:30

If I must needs glory, I will glory of the things which concern mine infirmities.

2 Corinthians 11:28-29

Beside those things that are without, that which cometh upon me daily, the care of all the churches. 29 Who is weak (astheneō), and I am not weak? who is offended, and I burn not (overwhelmed with anger)?

2 Corinthians 12:10

Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in distresses for Christ's sake: for when I am weak, then am I strong.

Galatians 4:12-14

Brethren, I beseech you, be as I am; for I am as ye are: ye have not injured me at all. 13 -- Ye know how through infirmity (astheneia) of the flesh I preached the gospel unto you at the first. 14 And my temptation which was in my flesh ye despised not, nor rejected; but received me as an angel of God, even as Christ Jesus.

1 Timothy 5:23

Drink no longer water, but use a little wine for thy stomach's sake and thine often infirmities.

1 Corinthians 11:27-32

Wherefore whosoever shall eat this bread, and drink this cup of the Lord, unworthily, shall be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord. 28 But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of that bread, and drink of that cup. 29 For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord's body. 30 For this cause many are weak (asthenēs) and sickly (arrhōstos) among you, and many sleep. 31 For if we would judge ourselves, we should not be judged. 32 But when we are judged, we are chastened of the Lord, that we should not be condemned with the world.

[arrhōstos]

Mark 6:12-13 (KJV) 12 And they went out, and preached that men should repent. 13 And they cast out many devils, and anointed with oil many that were sick (arrhōstos), and healed them.

Romans 10:17

So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.
